
People: Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.


PRAYER OF THE CHURCH




For those with health concerns, there is non-alcoholic white wine and gluten free wafers in the center of each tray. **TWO STATION COMMUNION:**
