



¹³ These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. ¹⁴ For people who speak thus make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵ If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶ But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city.

CONFESSION OF THE LUTHERAN FAITH

Apology of the Augsburg Confession: Art. XXI (IX): Of the Invocation of Saints

Pastor: Our Confession approves honors to the saints. For here a threefold honor is to be approved. The first is thanksgiving:

People: **For we ought to give thanks to God because He has shown examples of mercy; because He has shown that He wishes to save men; because He has given teachers or other gifts to the Church. And these gifts, as they are the greatest, should be amplified, and the saints themselves should be praised, who have faithfully used these gifts.**

Pastor: The second service is the strengthening of our faith;

People: **when we see the denial forgiven Peter, we also are encouraged to believe the more that grace truly superabounds over sin** *(Rom. 5:20)*.

Pastor: The third honor is the imitation, first, of faith, then of the other virtues,

People: **which everyone should imitate according to his calling.**
