

INVOCATION

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the *\text{Y} Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

CALL TO WORSHIP

Pastor: O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, you are one of the little clans of Judah.

People: But from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule Israel. His

kingdom is eternal.

Pastor: The people walking in darkness have seen a great light;

People: on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.

Pastor: For to us a child is born, to us a son is given,

People: and the government will be on his shoulders.

Pastor: And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,

People: Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Pastor: Stir up, Stir up, O Lord, the hearts that beat within our chests. Let them

pound in steady rhythm a song that prepares the world to meet and greet your only Son. Make his coming strong—strong enough to defeat our conflicts. Make his coming light bright enough to illuminate our path through this darkened world. For he is your only Son, who lives and reigns

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Pastor: All flesh is grass, and all its beauty is like the flower of the field. The grass

withers, the flower fades when the breath of the Lord blows on it; surely

the people are grass.

People: The grass withers, the flower fades, but the Word of our God will

stand forever.

Pastor: Behold, the Lord God comes with might, and His arm rules for Him;

behold, His reward is with Him, and His recompense before Him.

People: The Lord comes in judgment! As He comes, I stand guilty before

Him.

Pastor: Guilty before our God, without excuse, we confess our sinfulness to Him.

People: We confess before You, O Lord, that we are sinful. We have failed to

treasure Your Word and as a result we have lived for ourselves instead of living our lives for You. You intend Your Word to shine

forth light, yet, at times, we choose to live in darkness. We acknowledge Your just judgment and confess we deserve to be cast away from Your presence for all eternity. We trust not in ourselves

but in Your mercy through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Grant us

forgiveness for the sake of Him who sacrificed His very life that we may have eternal life.

Pastor: The Lord is not slow to fulfill His promise as some count slowness, but is

OLD TESTAMENT Ezekiel 34:11-16

(Of shepherds and sheep...)

¹¹ "For thus says the Lord God: Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out. ¹² As a shepherd seeks out his flock when he is among his sheep that have been scattered, so will I seek out my sheep, and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³ And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land. And I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the ravines, and in all the inhabited places of the country. ¹⁴ I will feed them with good pasture, and on the mountain heights of Israel shall be their grazing land. There they shall lie down in good grazing land, and on rich pasture they shall feed on the mountains of Israel. ¹⁵ I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I myself will make them lie down, declares the Lord God. ¹⁶ I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, and the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them in justice.

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

A PSALM AND A SONG

Psalm 23 and LSB 367 v. 2, 4

Pastor: The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.

People: Shepherds in the field abiding, Watching o'er your flocks by night.

He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he

restores my soul.

Pastor: He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

People: Come and worship, come and worship;

Worship Christ the newborn King.

Pastor: Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are

with me; your rod and your staff—they comfort me.

People: Saints before the altar bending, Watching long in hope and fear,

Pastor: You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint

my head with oil; my cup overflows.

People: Suddenly the Lord, descending, In His temple shall appear.

Pastor: Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; and I shall

dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

People: Come and worship, come and worship;

Worship Christ the newborn King.
