



CHRISTMAS GOSPEL







Communion will take place in two continuous lines at the altar.



Pastor Andrzejewski thinks that the next hymn "Infant Holy, Infant Lowly" deserves attention. W Żłobie Leży ("In the Manger He Lies") is a traditional Polish Christmas carol, and the only Polish hymn in our LSB hymnal. In 1920, the song was translated into English as "Infant Holy, Infant Lowly", after being found in a Polish hymnal Spiewniczek Piesni Koscieline (pub. 1908), though the song itself may date back as far as the 13th century. The Polish text is attributed to Piotr Skarga (1536-1612), a Polish contemporary of the Reformation.
