Pastor: Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us

lay aside every weight and sin which clings so closely,

People: and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us,

Pastor: looking unto Jesus, the Pioneer and Perfecter of our faith.

People: For the joy that was set before him, he endured the cross, despising

the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

our spirit that we are the children of God,

People: and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ.

Pastor: "This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached throughout the whole

world, as a testimony to all nations."

People: We are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God

has given to those who obey him.

Pastor: "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you; and you

shall be my witnesses."

People: We are witnesses to all that he did. They put him to death by hanging

him on a tree,

Pastor: but God raised him up on the third day and made him manifest,

People: not to all people, but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses.

(The fiery trial to come)

¹² Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery trial when it comes upon you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. ¹³ But rejoice insofar as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed. ¹⁴ If you are insulted for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. ¹⁵ But let none of you suffer as a murderer or a thief or an evildoer or as a meddler. ¹⁶ Yet if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in that name. ¹⁷ For it is time for judgment to begin at the household of God; and if it begins with us, what will be the outcome for those who do not obey the gospel of God? ¹⁸ And "If the righteous is scarcely saved, what will become of the ungodly and the sinner?"

(Crucify, crucify Him!)

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, chapter 23.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁸ But they all cried out together, "Away with this man, and release to us Barabbas"— ¹⁹ a man who had been thrown into prison for an insurrection started in the city and for murder. ²⁰ Pilate addressed them once more, desiring to release Jesus, ²¹ but they kept shouting, "Crucify, crucify him!" ²² A third time he said to them, "Why? What evil has he done? I have found in him no guilt deserving death. I will therefore punish and release him." ²³ But they were urgent, demanding with loud cries that he should be crucified. 
