Pastor: while God himself also bore witness by signs and wonders and various

miracles

People: and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his own will.

<u>VERSE</u> LSB 436 v. 1

Go to dark Gethsemane, All who feel the tempter's pow'r; Your Redeemer's conflict see, Watch with Him one bitter hour; Turn not from His griefs away; Learn from Jesus Christ to pray.

Pastor: Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us

lay aside every weight and sin which clings so closely,

People: and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us,

Pastor: looking unto Jesus, the Pioneer and Perfecter of our faith.

People: For the joy that was set before him, he endured the cross, despising

the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

<u>VERSE</u> LSB 436 v. 2

→ Follow to the judgment hall, View the Lord of life arraigned; Oh, the wormwood and the gall! Oh, the pangs His soul sustained! Shun not suff'ring, shame, or loss; Learn from Him to bear the cross.

Pastor: "These are my words which I spoke to you, while I was still with you, that

everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and the

psalms must be fulfilled."

People: We are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God

has given to those who obey him.

Pastor: When we cry, "Abba, Father," it is the Spirit himself bearing witness with

our spirit that we are the children of God,

People: and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ.

Pastor: "This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached throughout the whole

world, as a testimony to all nations."

People: We are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God

has given to those who obey him.

Pastor: "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you; and you

shall be my witnesses."

People: We are witnesses to all that he did. They put him to death by hanging

him on a tree,

Pastor: but God raised him up on the third day and made him manifest,

People: not to all people, but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses.

<u>VERSE</u> LSB 436 v. 3

Calv'ry's mournful mountain climb; There, adoring at His feet, Mark that miracle of time, God's own sacrifice complete. "It is finished!" hear Him cry; Learn from Jesus Christ to die.


